

## PATHWAYS Leadership for Progress

### Application for 2019 academic year scholarship to Georgia Gwinnett College (GGC)

PATHWAYS Leadership for Progress announces the availability of a \$1000 scholarship to help students who have experienced foster care or homelessness. The goal of the scholarship to help defray the cost of tuition/ books/living expenses as well as encourage the development of leadership characteristics through carrying out a community project.

Eligibility If you meet the following requirements, you are eligible to apply for the PATHWAYS Leadership for Progress scholarship.

- You have experienced being a foster child in the Georgia foster care system (please provide letter indicating you have experienced foster care from Georgia DFCF) or have experienced homelessness (please provide letter indicating you have experienced homelessness from a social worker or other relevant professional).
- You have completed no more than 2 semesters at GGC and have at least a 3.0 GPA.
- You are a currently a high school senior who has been accepted to GGC and have at least a 3.0 GPA.
- Be interested in and willing to carry out a community project to gain leadership skills.

Application Deadline: **July 1, 2019**

Selection Process The committee will review all applications in July 2019. Selection criteria will include: the project idea, the feasibility of carrying it out in one year, how it connects to the student's future goals, and the extent to which it is sustainable and tied to other partner organizations. The top candidates will be notified and asked to interview in person. The successful candidate will be asked to report on their academic and project progress monthly

Note: Preference will be given to students from disadvantaged backgrounds. Finalists will be asked to appear for an interview. Please be mindful that this is not simply a scholarship program. The person selected will be expected to maintain good grades and work on their community projects and communicate with PATHWAYS leadership at least monthly. Success in meeting these expectations will be considered in renewal of the scholarship.

Methods, Anticipated Problems and Solutions, Implications. The implications and possible applications of results of the proposed project to the ultimate improvement of the community should be described. **THE PROPOSAL MAY NOT EXCEED 2 PAGES**. Please attach the 2 page project proposal to this application.
